



In California, Almost *Everyone* Can Vote

Most Californians have the right to vote, even if they are in jail, on parole, or on probation.

You have the right to vote:

- On parole
- On probation
- In county jail:
 - Serving a misdemeanor sentence
 - As a condition of probation (misdemeanor or felony)
 - Serving a felony jail sentence
 - Awaiting trial
 - For a parole violation
- On mandatory supervision
- On post-release community supervision
- On federal supervised release

On November 3, 2020 California voters passed Proposition 17 which amended the California constitution to allow those on parole the right to vote, effective immediately.
